why this election matters

As we head into a federal election, there is a worrying trend of countries cutting support for international assistance. Our future Members of Parliament (MPs) need to hear that everyday Canadians like us don't want Canada to turn its back to our world. Canadian international assistance is an investment that helps to stop conflicts, prevent pandemics, and build strong economies at home and abroad.



Canada's commitment to a world without poverty and its willingness to back this commitment with resources must not be taken for granted. By working together, we can use this election to generate new political momentum in Canada for international assistance.

Canada has a long legacy of making an impact around the globe no matter who is in power, showing that supporting the health, wellbeing, and dignity of people everywhere is a fundamental Canadian value.

Countries like the US, UK, and the Netherlands have slashed international assistance budgets, putting millions of lives at risk and jeopardizing decades of progress toward the eradication of extreme poverty. For example:

Afghanistan

In Afghanistan, 9 million no longer have access to healthcare due to clinic closures.


Sudan

In war-torn Sudan, food centres are shuttered, leaving millions to go hungry.

Canada

In Canada, we're at risk as many key programs tracking and responding to infectious disease outbreaks (like Ebola, bird flu) are suspended.

Now is the time for our voices to be heard and to tell our local candidates that we want Canada's next government to have a strong role in tackling the most pressing global challenges.






