investing in Canadian aid for the world we need

In 2022, Results Canada launched an advocacy plan for <u>#TheWorldWeNeed</u> to urge Canada to step up global pandemic recovery by increasing its International Assistance Envelope (IAE) by CAD\$1.5 billion above the 2020-21 Budget commitment.

parliamentarians

budget 2022 advocacy

Our staff and volunteers joined <u>Cooperation Canada</u>, the <u>Canadian Partnership for Women and Children's Health</u>, and <u>Bigger than our Borders</u> to organize a Week of Action during International Development Week (IDW) to engage more than 50 parliamentarians on our IAE ask. Then in April, Canada heard our call and announced an <u>increase in the IAE</u> to a total of CAD\$8.15 billion in 2022.

Pandemic Proof the World event

During IDW, Results Canada held Pandemic Proof the World: a global parliamentary discussion on ending pandemics old and new with community health care workers, experts, advocates, and decision makers in Canada and Kenya. The event highlighted how Canadian aid helps to ensure pandemic preparedness organizations like TB Alliance, the Foundation for Innovative New Diagnostics, the Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovation, and the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria (Global Fund) can continue their critical work.

Participating Canadian parliamentarians also received an interactive "<u>virtual delegation</u>" experience, which included stories from affected communities produced with our global partners who were part of the event.

I really enjoyed witnessing the event. After over two years of virtual events, I really appreciated the efforts to create a novel experience and virtually transport participants to Kenya and to build a connection with Kenyan parliamentarians, front-line workers, and people with TB.






ensuring equitable access to COVID-19 tools

We called on Canada to continue investing its fair share in high-impact solutions critical to achieving global health for all during the pandemic and beyond, such as the Access to COVID-19 Tools Accelerator (ACT-A).

access to COVID-19 Tools Accelerator motion

In January, MP Nathaniel Erskine-Smith tabled a motion in Parliament pushing Canada to send more COVID-19 vaccines to low-income countries and called on Canada to invest CAD\$1.1 billion on top of the CAD\$1.3 billion already pledged to the ACT-A. Thank you for being so vocal about vaccine equity.



Canada recommits its fair share investment

On May 12, **Prime Minister Justin Trudeau** announced an investment of

CAD\$732 million, recommitting its fair
share in the ACT-A.

a witness before the standing Committee

On April 4, Results Canada's Director of Policy and Advocacy Robyn Waite was invited as a witness before the Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs and International Development (FAAE) undertaking a study on vaccine equity. Results Canada called for equitable distribution of resources to COVID-19 testing, treatments and vaccines.













protecting women and children's health

Results Canada called on Canada to do its part to protect the health of women, children, and adolescents during the COVID-19 pandemic and beyond by investing CAD\$100 million in the Global Financial Facility for Women, Children, and Adolescents (GFF).

global financial facility for women, children, and adolescents replenishment

Hon. Minister Harjit Sajjan responded to our call by announcing CAD\$50 million for the GFF at the Nutrition for Growth (N4G) Summit in December 2021. Then in April 2022 Minister Sajjan co-hosted the GFF's official Reclaim the Gains campaign replenishment event, and announced an additional CAD\$40 million investment.



In late 2021, we were invited to speak as youth leaders at the N4G youth webinar hosted by GFF. The objective was to increase financial and policy commitments to tackle the malnutrition crisis at the N4G Summit the following week. There were 30 youth leaders from around the world on how we can engage in advocacy to help secure these commitments. We recommended that youth feel empowered to reach out to policymakers and explain why nutrition is personally important to them as constituents.

Every year, on March 24 Results Canada marks World Tuberculosis Day to raise awareness for tuberculosis (TB), stand in solidarity for the millions of people affected by the disease, and call on increased efforts to eliminate it. This year, we advocated for Canada to reaffirm its commitments to ending TB by investing in proven mechanisms like TB REACH and the Global Fund.

Canada pledges to fund TB REACH

To commemorate World TB Day, Results Canada hosted an event at the Ottawa sign. During the event, Minister Sajjan announced a CAD\$11 million pledge to TB REACH, an innovative financing mechanism that effectively locates people with TB in hard-to-reach communities to ensure that they can access the care that they need.

We were so happy that Minister Sajjan made a commitment to TB REACH on World TB Day! Our group had worked really hard to get seven Vancouver landmarks lit up in red for the occasion, and the pledge made us so excited about the power of our advocacy.

report on the impact of COVID-19 on TB

To gain support for TB elimination in Canada, Stop TB Canada published a survey report on the impact of COVID-19 on TB programs in Canada and sent it to 70 MPs in Canadian regions that have a high prevalence of TB.


fighting HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, and malaria

Our multi-month #FightForWhatCounts campaign called on **Prime Minister Justin Trudeau** for a bold investment of CAD\$1.2 billion to fight HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, and malaria and help strengthen global systems for a pandemic-proof world.



Week of Action to #FightForWhatCounts

Results Canada along with <u>ONE Canada</u>, <u>Grandmothers advocacy Network</u>, <u>Global Citizen Canada</u>, and other partners hosted a <u>Week of Action</u> from May 30 to June 3 to garner support among Canada's parliamentarians for the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria's Seventh Replenishment. We connected with 40 MPs and Senators across party lines.

In June, Results Canada marched in the **Toronto Pride parade** as part of a coalition of 14 partners, drag queens, and a marching band. We secured over 13 media appearances, including coverage by Global News to amplify our ask.



Results Canada also took to the streets of the **Ottawa Pride** parade to engage with Ottawa Pride attendees in August as a final push ahead of the Seventh Replenishment.



This investment represents the largest investment Canada has made towards any international financing institution for health.

meeting a minister for the first time

Shortly after World TB Day, **Hon. Minister Harjit Sajjan** hosted a meetand-greet in his constituency. Still excited by the recent <u>funding announcement</u> to TB REACH, Dylan took the opportunity to meet a minister for the first time and thank Minister Sajjan in-person on behalf of all Vancouver-based volunteers.



Cold, wet, and nervousness. These three words sum up the first moments of walking up to Minister Sajjan in the corner of Fraser and 49th in Vancouver. Canadian politics was never my thing, moreover meeting people in office was never a space I would find myself in. But that rainy afternoon later ended up with me walking away beaming with empowerment that no amount of rain can wash away.

Meeting a Member of Parliament up close, in a mundane environment, not in any fancy office or in any marble covered building, made the experience more memorable. As a citizen and more of as a youth, the experience felt inspiring, that change is but a simple conversation away with a minister in a random street that often starts with a hi.


winning in Winnipeg


