# GameChangers for 2030

In 2023, Results Canada launched our #GameChangers for the Global Goals campaign. With intensifying global challenges, our world needs bold innovations to provide solutions to persistent challenges and game-changing decision-makers to lead in our quest to eradicate poverty. We are halfway to the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals – and we have a lot of ground to make up.

This year, Results Canada advocated for Canadian leadership in implementing and championing innovative approaches, new technologies, and smart and flexible financing.

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau responded to the need for game-changing investments by announcing that Canada is increasing its contribution on Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) to low-income countries for much-needed climate action, future pandemic preparedness, and poverty reduction from 18% to 26% - an investment of \$1.3 billion!









## Canadian investments in our world



In 2023, Results Canada called on Canada to #KeepThePromise and increase the International Assistance Envelope (IAE) every year by investing an additional \$1.85 billion above the 2022 budget to \$10 billion. Although budget 2023 did not include the level of increase we asked for, the Canadian Government has said it remains committed to increasing the IAE in the years ahead.

Results Canada staff and volunteers with partners at Cooperation Canada and the ONE Campaign came together to call for increased Canadian investments in international assistance during February's annual International Development Week (IDW). ## forging global connections

In January, Results Canada organized an educational delegation to Kenya with MP Scott Aitchison, MP Valerie Bradford, MP Igwinder Gaheer, and MP Eric Melillo. We had the opportunity to see firsthand the impact of Canadian aid – from life-saving interventions in early childhood development, tuberculosis, maternal health, and nutrition to high-impact initiatives in education.

Thanks to the support of civil society partners in Kenya including KANCO, UNICEF, Nutrition International, FIND, the global alliance for diagnostics, Stop TB Partnership, and TB Alliance, we were able to meet with Canadian international development organizations, Kenyan parliamentarians, local civil society organizations, community health care workers, and community members.







### Women Deliver

In July, Results Canada attended the Women Deliver conference in Kigali, Rwanda, to catalyze action and impact for gender equality. Here, Results Canada hosted an official side-event with UNICEF on the importance of supporting community health workers, made interventions at a Ministerial roundtable, attended highlevel meetings on gender equality, and met with partners and stakeholders from around the world.



At Women Deliver, Canada announced \$200 million to uphold and promote the health and rights of women and girls, including their sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR), and \$25 million to scale up solutions for women's unpaid care work.

# ending tuberculosis

On March 24, Results Canada commemorates World Tuberculosis Day – a day to stand in solidarity with the millions of people around the world who are affected by tuberculosis (TB) and call for increased efforts to eliminate the world's deadliest infectious disease. This year, we worked with parliamentarians to address one of the greatest barriers to ending TB: that approximately 4 million people with the disease are missed by health systems every year. To help reach the "missing millions", we called on the Canadian Government to renew its investment in the Stop TB Partnership's TB REACH initiative. TB REACH is an innovative financing mechanism that effectively locates people in hard-to-reach communities so that they can access the care that they need and would otherwise go without.





Parliamentarians across party lines joined us for a World TB Day reception to reflect on Canada's efforts in the quest to end TB. Thank you to MP Pam Damoff for hosting the event along with cohosts, MP Lori Idlout and MP Gary Vidal. We're also grateful to Tina Campbell, member of Stop TB Canada's Steering committee and a Registered Nurse, for speaking and sharing her experience treating and living with TB and the disproportionate impact of the disease on Indigenous peoples in Canada.

In a Statement in the House on World TB Day, **MP Pam Damoff** reiterated her support for Canada's leadership towards TB elimination: "Today I want to let Canadians from coast to coast to coast know that ending tuberculosis is possible."

# UN High-level meeting on TB & TB REACH

Ahead of September's United Nations High Level Meeting (HLM) on TB, Results Canada advocated for the Canadian government to show up to the meeting with strong commitments to help end TB, including new investments in TB research and development (R&D). As part of this campaign, we worked with MPs whose communities have been particularly impacted by TB, including MP Brendan Hanley, MP Lori Idlout, MP Michael McLeod, MP Gary Vidal, and MP Salma Zahid. We're grateful that they shared their powerful stories with us to help emphasize the need for greater TB elimination efforts.



Results Canada worked with parliamentarians to directly influence Canadian leadership ahead of the TB HLM. Thank you to MP Don Davies for sending a letter to Canada's ambassador to the UN, Hon. While Canada missed its opportunity to announce increased investments in TB R&D at the TB HLM, we celebrate Canada's investment of \$25.5 million to TB REACH, which was announced on the sidelines of the meeting during the UN General Assembly, building on its historic pledge in 2022 to The Global Fund to Fight AIDS, TB and Malaria. We continue to work with parliamentary champions to call for the funding needed to improve the tools available to prevent, diagnose, and treat TB.




# day of action

We will call on Canada to continue supporting lifesaving mechanisms like GAVI, The Vaccine Alliance and to renew and maintain the legacy and leadership of the Charlevoix Declaration to ensure we #ReachEveryChild.
