In 2025, Results Canada launched our [#TogetherWeLead](#) campaign. Our world has changed dramatically over the course of 2025. Climate change, conflicts, economic instability, and the dismantling of USAID have threatened the lives of millions around the world and jeopardized decades of hard-won progress toward ending extreme poverty worldwide.

Amid this uncertainty, one reality has remained constant: the need for Canadian global leadership. Canada's strength lies in our ability to unite global partners in supporting the most marginalized and remaining

committed to global solutions. For decades and across different governments, Canada has provided leadership in crucial moments, from helping to end apartheid in South Africa, to standing up for the health and rights of women and girls around the world through the Feminist International Assistance Policy.

This cross-party consensus of supporting democracy, human rights, and global health has been crucial in shaping Canada's role in the world and in benefitting our own economy and stability.


# meeting the moment

results



In January, US President Donald Trump froze US international assistance spending and began the [dismantling of USAID](#). These cuts threaten millions of lives around the world and jeopardize decades of progress in eradicating deadly diseases and ending global poverty. Thank you to **MP Parm Bains**, **Sen. Andrew Cardozo**, and **MP Andréanne Larouche** for meeting with us to discuss the devastating impacts of this and how Canada can step up to meet the moment.

In February, Results Canada co-hosted an event with **Lieutenant-General (ret'd) the Honourable Roméo Dallaire**, to shine a spotlight on the importance of ensuring children living in conflict and emergency settings have access to quality



education. During this event, experts discussed how education systems can be strengthened to promote social cohesion, conflict resolution, and the healing and recovery of children impacted by crisis.

This event was held in partnership with the [Dallaire Institute for Children, Peace and Security](#), the [Global Partnership for Education](#), and the Canadian International Education Policy Working Group (CIEPWG), a coalition of over 24 international development and humanitarian organizations working to improve access to quality education for all children. Canada also has a critical role to play in leveraging its influence, leadership, and political capital at international financing institutions like the World Bank, ensuring that its financial impact is maximized while placing marginalized communities and their needs at the centre. # a better world

results

This spring, Results Canada volunteers flipped the script on election campaigns, and door knocked local campaign offices. Volunteer advocates from across Canada used our [Election Toolkit](#) to take action and let candidates campaigning to be their MP know that everyday people in Canada care about building a better, healthier world.

By attending all-candidate forums, dropping by campaign offices, and talking to candidates and canvassers, Results Canada volunteers and partners highlighted their pride in Canadian international assistance investments which have helped to:

- cut child mortality in half since 2000;
- eradicate polio almost everywhere in the world; and
- lift over 1 billion people out of extreme poverty since 2000.



# #FeedOurFuture

Nutrition is one of the most cost-effective investments to build a better world. Each dollar invested in fighting malnutrition can generate a staggering \$23 return! It is not only the right thing to do, but a strategic opportunity.

In 2025, the Government of Canada seized this opportunity. In February, **Hon. Ahmed Hussen** announced an investment of [\\$360.6 million over six years into Nutrition International](#). And, in September, **Hon. Randeep Sarai** announced a [\\$78 million investment in the Child Nutrition Fund](#).

By investing in nutrition, Canada will help fight stunting, severe wasting, and anemia and give more children and mothers the chance to survive and thrive.

# immunizing for our future

results

In the second half of 2024, Results Canada launched the [#ForOurFuture](#) campaign, calling on Canada to step up and make bold commitments to ensure that every child has access to lifesaving vaccines.

Throughout this campaign, Results Canada advocates sent thousands of letters and emails to MPs, met with decision-makers, published letters to the editor, and even shared [personal testimonies](#) about how immunization has shaped their lives, calling for continued Canadian support for global immunization.



In March 2025, the Government of Canada responded to this call by making a pledge of [\\$675 million over five years to Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance](#). This investment will protect children from preventable deaths by increasing access to vaccines for malaria, dengue, and tuberculosis, and will also help eliminate cervical cancer by improving access to HPV vaccines. Several Results volunteers and Fellows who advocate for this pledge were able to attend and participate in the official announcement. Thank you, **Hon. Ahmed Hussen**, for continuing Canada's global leadership.

# lighting up red for TB

Every year on March 24, Results Canada commemorates World Tuberculosis Day – a day to stand in solidarity with the millions of people around the world who are affected by tuberculosis (TB) and call for increased efforts to eliminate the world's deadliest infectious disease.

Results volunteer advocates requested that landmarks in their communities be lit red to commemorate World TB Day. Because of their efforts, a record **57** monuments across Canada shone bright on the day to raise awareness for TB and highlight the work that remains to eliminate this deadly disease.



Watch Statement



In January, [Stop TB Canada](#), with support from Results Canada and other partners, released its new report: [Access to Essential Tuberculosis Medicines in Canada: Insights from National Survey of Healthcare Providers](#) providing a snapshot of the barriers limiting timely access to TB treatment across Canada.

Thank you to **MP Lori Idlout** for her powerful statement highlighted in the report:

*“I hope that these recommendations will be implemented to improve access to essential TB medicines for all people in Canada [and that] more investments will be made to address the social determinants of health, such as housing, so that communities like Nunavummiut, that have the highest rates of TB infection in Canada do not contract this disease.”*

In September, parliamentarians from across party lines joined us for a [#LeadOnTB reception](#) to reflect on Canada's efforts in the quest to end TB here at home and around the world. We were thrilled to be joined by powerful TB survivor and advocate, Ani Herna Sari, who travelled to Ottawa from Indonesia to share her story of living with – and defeating – tuberculosis.

***"This pattern holds my story. Shattered glass, breaking free of shame. Bitter pills, blooming flowers – my pain became my purpose. We must end tuberculosis. We cannot stop now."***

While this represents a cut from Canada's previous pledge and not the level of investment we had hoped for, we remain confident **Canada will continue to champion global health and human rights on the world stage at this difficult and uncertain time.**

# making an impact

results

From engaging in pre-budget consultations to attending events with parliamentarians, Results Canada volunteers continue to advocate and work across party lines to generate the political will end extreme poverty around the world.

The backbone of our network are our Volunteer Ambassadors and group leaders, who coordinate and inspire over 500 volunteer advocates across Canada. They lead by example and support their peers to become strong and passionate advocates for global issues.

The impact of our volunteer advocates' efforts have been highlighted in 25 publications across Canada, include the *Toronto Star*, *The Hill Times*, and *Le Devoir*. This year, our volunteers submitted over 2,000 letters to the editor and op-eds, with over 150 published. In these letters, they called for continued Canadian leadership in the fight to end tuberculosis, to ensure women and children have access to the nutrition they need to thrive, and more.

# celebrating five years of the Results Fellowship Program

In the fifth year of Results Canada's Fellowship Program, two carefully selected cohorts were brought together to engage on global issues and grow as leaders and advocates. These 82 Fellows met monthly and took action weekly to learn about solutions to our world's malnutrition crisis and the critical importance of vaccination in our fight against our world's deadliest diseases. Through this program, Fellows from across Canada published letters to the editor and op-eds, met with parliamentarians, and learned how to use digital advocacy tools to engage with decision-makers.

# looking ahead to 2026

results

We recognize that, now more than ever, governments and parliamentarians are balancing competing priorities – both domestic and global. Yet even in this context, **there remains a strong and urgent case for Canadian leadership in global cooperation and poverty eradication.**

Recent data show that, for the first time this century, [the number of children under five who are expected to die has risen](#), largely due to sharp reductions in international health funding – reversing decades of hard-won gains.

This moment is a **critical inflection point**: without renewed commitment, millions more lives could be lost and progress toward ending poverty and disease stalled. But with targeted investments and smart, innovative approaches, we can **stretch every dollar** further and accelerate impact even in a constrained fiscal environment.

Innovations, from vaccines requiring fewer doses to data-driven health interventions, can deliver greater impact per dollar and expand reach to underserved communities.

Canada has a proud legacy in development cooperation and global health in particular. By doubling down on innovation, championing cost-effective solutions, and sustaining our global development commitments, we can help ensure that our contributions not only uphold our values but **translate into measurable, life-saving impact** around the world.

This is not just a moral imperative – it is a strategic choice that reinforces Canada's role as a trusted global partner at a time when leadership matters most.
